

COVID-19 Frequently Asked Questions

Q: Which kids are allowed to come to camp this summer?

A: At this time the camp is not required by law to have campers show proof of vaccination. We will however need to follow government regulations as they change. Upon registration we will be screening all kids before they enter the camp. This screening includes a symptom check and temperature check. Any child displaying 2 or more symptoms will not be permitted to enter camp until they have fully recovered.

Q: How will physical distancing be possible at camp?

A: We will be “bubbling” the kids here at camp. As per the Government of New Brunswick regulations for day cares and summer camps, campers will remain in their cabin groups which will not exceed 15 campers and 3 staff. Within their bubble distancing will not be required but all bubbles will be kept physically distanced from each other.

Q: Can I get a refund?

A: If for any reason the camp must close, and we are not able to accommodate our campers, full refunds will be issued. If your child is not able to attend because of circumstances beyond your control a full refund will be issued, for example being infected with Covid. If you register your child, and government regulations change since the time you registered that will inhibit your child from attending we will issue a full refund.

Q: Are there consequences for campers who do not respect physical distancing?

A: We want all kids to have a full week here at camp but unfortunately if the rules can't be followed, we have no choice but to send the camper home. Once the cabin leader has issues with the camper they will be addressed by our leadership staff who will make a decision regarding the camper's behaviour, if necessary they will be sent home.

Q: How will registration work?

A: We have a newly designed drive-thru registration process that we will be implementing this year. It is asked that only one designated parent accompanies the child to drop them off at camp. Parents will remain in their vehicle for the entirety of this process. There will be 6 stations; welcome to camp/COVID-19 screening, lice checks, office, Shiktehawk Shack, nurses' station, drop off zone. Don't worry if it sounds confusing, we have lots of signs and people to guide you along the way!
